DUBBO RUGBY CLUB HISTORY

Rugby in the central western area of NSW has shown remarkable resilience and growth since the 1850s, despite the challenges of wartime and economic downturns. The sport was played in the established areas of Bathurst and Orange districts, with records showing games played as early as 1874. A testament to this resilience is the photograph of the 1899 Dubbo XV, proudly displayed on the wall of the Dubbo Clubhouse. The club's commitment to rugby was evident even during the Great Depression of the 1930's, and in the early 1950's, Wellington and district fielded seven rugby teams in a district competition.

The Dubbo Club was reformed in 1963 after a six-year lapse. Their colours for the year were white jerseys and whatever shorts and socks were available at the time. The next year, they changed to sky-blue jerseys. In the early 1970s, a red kangaroo was added.


After winning the Grand Final in the Far West Zone in 1966, the club transferred to the Central West competition, entering teams in 1967. This decision provided the club with more rugby over the year.

In 1971, the Dubbo Rugby Club commenced operating a licensed clubhouse directly opposite Victoria Park, the only rugby club in the west with licensed facilities. The Clubhouse operated for 16 years before being placed in receivership in 1987. A meeting in 1996 at Number 1 Oval between the General Manager of Dubbo council and the Club President concluded that the then public toilet block would be renovated and expanded to the current Clubhouse. Although technically, the Clubhouse belonged to the Council, the Dubbo Rugby Club was granted permanent residency. The Dubbo Junior Rugby Club was formed in 1990 and has grown dramatically. It is now one of country NSW's largest and most successful junior clubs.

The DKRC has consistently been a leading club within the Central West competition both on and off the field. They won three premierships in a row from 2006 - 2008 and a further premiership in 2014. The Roos have won seven premierships since 1972.

In 2018, the Dubbo Rugby Club significantly promoted gender equality in sports by founding the Westfund Ferguson Cup and starting a women's 10's competition in 2019. The club's commitment to women's rugby was further demonstrated in 2022 when the competition expanded to 15-a-side competition. The Dubbo Rugby Club has been home to a thriving women's rugby scene, with past players being selected for international and NSW country honours. Since the competition's formation, the Roos women's team has been a dominant force, playing in four grand finals and winning three consecutive from 2022 to 2024.


Through appropriate resource allocation, our coaches, players, and volunteers are provided with development opportunities enhancing the club's growth of administration/management/team support and players through education and training.



It's imperative that we develop strong and defined pathways for junior club members, guiding them through colts and senior grades. We aim to further these pathways into representative and high-level competitions.





Leverage major events and link with CWRU, NSWRU, and Rugby Australia to capitalise on state championship matches played to showcase our local competition.


We actively target mainstream media to promote the game, our club, and our events, expanding our networking and footprint within the rugby Australia community.


